CANNADAY, Mr. Mannsville Wray - Age 66, passed away Monday, January 18, 2021 at Hurley Medical Center. Family hour 10:00 AM Thursday, February 18, 2021 from the Chapel of Lawrence E. Moon Funeral Home, 906 W. Flint Park Blvd., with funeral service commencing at 11:00 AM. Entombment at Sunset Hills Mausoleum, G-4413 Flushing Rd. Friends and pallbearers will assemble at the funeral home 10:00 AM Thursday. Mr. Cannaday will lie in state in the Chapel of Lawrence E. Moon Funeral Home, and may be viewed from 4:00 PM - 6:00 PM Wednesday.

Mannsville Wray Cannaday, mostly known as "Wray", departed this life on Monday, January 18, 2021 accepting God's Call to come home.

Mannsville W. Cannaday was born on March 6, 1954 in Roanoke, Virginia. He was one of three children of Billy K. Cannaday, Sr, and Barbara Jean Cannaday and reared in Roanoke, Virginia. Wray was also a former resident of Flint, Michigan and a former member of New Jerusalem Full Gospel Baptist Church of Flint, Michigan. He was baptized and educated in Roanoke, Virginia Public Schools graduating from William Fleming High School. Wray continued his education at Salisbury University in Salisbury, Maryland where he obtained a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Elementary Education and Eastern Michigan University in Ypsilanti, Michigan obtaining a Master of Arts in Elementary Education.

Mannsville W. Cannaday had a passion for athletics and his career was extensive. He loved sports; played football and basketball during his high school years and enjoyed playing in various tennis tournaments while attending Salisbury State University in Salisbury, Maryland. Mannsville worked for many years for Flint Community Schools at Coolidge, Eisenhower, Carpenter Road and Manley Elementary Schools. He enjoyed working as a Community School Director, Teacher, and Principal. He was named Head Coach of Women's Basketball at Mott Community College in Flint, Michigan receiving recognition as NJCAA coach of the year. At Wake Forest University in Winston Salem, North Carolina he was an Assistant Women's Basketball Coach, and at University of Illinois as an Assistant Women's Basketball Coach in Champaign, Illinois. He was also

principal of Charlotte Mecklenburg Schools, Charlotte, North Carolina and principal of Warren County Schools in Warrenton, North Carolina.

Wray also taught health/physical education at the middle and high school level in Roanoke, Virginia.

Upon his retirement, Wray resided in Charlotte, North Carolina where he continued to be employed in Union County Public School District, Waxhaw, North Carolina as a teacher. He was a member of Park Church in Charlotte, North Carolina until a steady decline in his health. Wray touched the lives of many people personally, spiritually, and privately throughout the years as a true mentor, coach, teacher, administrator and friend. He will be deeply missed by everyone and his legacy will live on. Being a self-less person, he worked collaboratively with others, to maximize learning for all staff, students, and parents. To know him, is to love him for who he was and how he always looked for the best in others and gave the best he had.

Mannsville W. Cannaday was preceded in death by his beloved parents, Billy K. Cannaday, Sr, and Barbara Jean Cannaday and sister, Mary Ann Robinson.

Mannsville is survived by his two daughters (the love of his life) Aignier K. Cannaday and Taryne M. Cannaday of Flint, Michigan and his brother, Billy K. Cannaday Jr, of Chesterfield County, Virginia.
