Mrs. Hamilton relocated to Flint, Michigan in 1954 and worked as a Nurses Aide at McLaren Regional Medical Center until she was injured. Mrs. Hamilton was later employed at Willow Manor as a senior companion where she enjoyed assisting other seniors until her passing.
