LANE, Mr. Bennie James, Sr. - Age 72, on November 13, 2011, after courageously fighting brain cancer and the effects of the disease for 2 years and 9 months, Bennie gave his last earthly smile on his favorite day of the week, Sunday at Brian's House in Davison, MI. Funeral service 11 a.m. Friday, November 18, 2011 at Mt. Pisgah Baptist Church, 6415 N. Clio Rd. Rev. A.J. Harris, officiating. Pastor Wallace Hill III, Host Pastor. Interment Sunset Hills Cemetery, G-4413 Flushing Rd. Friends and pallbearers will assemble at the church 11 a.m. Friday. Mr. Lane will lie in state in the Chapel of Lawrence E. Moon Funeral Home, 906 W. Flint Park Blvd, from 12 Noon-8p.m. Thursday. Mr. Bennie James Lane, Sr. was born Aug 15, 1939 in Montgomery County, Georgia to Willie Floyd and Dessie (Gillis) Lane. Bennie accepted Jesus Christ as his personal Savior at an early age. He was educated in the Montgomery County School System. Upon graduating he left Georgia and lived in Miami, FL and moved back home to Uvalda, GA to drive the school bus when his dad became ill and was also a school cook. "BJ" could make a mean pound cake! After some of his friends and family moved to Flint; Bennie made his way here also. He began his General Motors Career November 30, 1964 and rarely missed work retiring on July 31, 2000. Bennie had a passion for music, even having his own singing group in Georgia. He was a member of Bethel UMC's Gospel Choir, Senior Choir, Male Chorus and the Eureka Lodge Glee Club. Bennie was a dedicated church member and was faithful in his service to the Lord. He had been a Sunday School Teacher,

Van Driver, Usher, Bible Class Member, Certified Lay Speaker, Kitchen Worker and Stewardship Leader. Bennie was a member of Eureka Lodge #16 and was a Past Master; he also served in other houses of the Masonic Organization as well. He was knowledgeable in God's word and even in sickness could recall scriptures without hesitation. "BJ" was a member of Bethel UMC until he and his family moved to Lawrenceville, GA in 2008. Upon returning to Flint in 2010, Bennie united with Mt. Pisgah Baptist Church, although he couldn't attend services like he would have loved too, he loved his Pastor and Church family—talking about Pastor's sermons long after he had heard them personally or by CD. Bennie was known for his smile. Every medical office he visited the staff would always comment on his smile and how he would light up a room when he did, which even in sickness he did often.
