Deacon Bernard Alexander was born May 17, 1932 in McComb, Mississippi, the son of Johnny and Alma (Jacob) Alexander. Deacon Alexander was a resident of Flint since 1956. He retired in 1990 with 34 years of seniority. Deacon Alexander was united in marriage to Annie Jean Lynch on February 1, 1975. He received the Holy Ghost on December 15, 1974 and was a faithful member of Greater Emmanuel Temple Church since that glorious day.
