JOHNSON, Mr. Bobbie Louis, Sr. - Age 91, went home to be with the Lord, Saturday, February 25, 2012. Family hour 11 a.m. Saturday, March 3, 2012 at Divine Grace Ministries Church, 3271 E. Atherton Rd, Burton, MI., with funeral service commencing at 12Noon. Pastor Michael Townsend, officiating, Apostle Bobby G. Johnson, Host Pastor. Interment Great Lakes National Cemetery, G-4200 Belford Rd., Holly, MI. Friends and pallbearers will assemble at the church 11 a.m. Saturday. Mr. Johnson will lie in state in the Chapel of Lawrence E. Moon Funeral Home, 906 W. Flint Park Blvd., and may be viewed from 1-8 p.m. Friday. Mr. Bobbie L. Johnson, Sr. was born September 9, 1920 in Thornton, Arkansas the oldest of 13 children to Rufus Johnson, Sr. and Ernestine (Braswell) Johnson. Mr. Johnson was a World War II Veteran of the United States Navy, where he served with distinction and was Honorably Discharged. On July 7, 1952, he married Aretha Hazel Plant-Johnson and adopted her 3 children, Julia J. (Arlandist) Johnson-McCollum, Alvin (Johnson) Swiney (Deceased) and Ollie (Johnson) Montgemory. To that union one child was born, Bobby G. (Mary) Johnson Jr. He worked in the Saginaw Community most of his life in the automotive service field and later (after retirement) as a store greeter at Kmart in Saginaw. Mr. Johnson was a faithful (charter) member of Divine Grace Ministries Church, often driving 30 miles to church beyond his 90th birthday. He is survived by: former wife and the fore-mentioned children; 14 grandchildren; 19 great-grandchildren; siblings, Emma Calahan, Pastor Rufus Johnson, Jr., and Ernestine Rayford; a

host of nieces and nephews. Mr. Johnson was preceded in death by his parents; and 9 siblings. The family wishes to extend thanks to the Divine Grace Ministries Church Family, doctors, nurses and staff of the Saginaw VA Hospital.
