April 15, 1944 - August 29, 2010

HAYMAN, Mr. Cardozia, Jr. "Doe" - Age 66, of Flint, went to be with the Lord, Sunday, August 29, 2010, due to head injuries sustained in a car accident that occurred in 1991. Family hour 10 a.m. Saturday, September 4, 2010 at Vernon Chapel AME Church, 5802 Dupont St., with funeral service commencing at 11 a.m., Pastor Daniel Johnson officiating, Pastor Ernest J. Garrison, Sr., Host Pastor Interment Sunset Hills Cemetery, G-4413 Flushing Rd. Friends and pallbearers will assemble at the funeral home, 10 a.m. Saturday. Mr. Hayman will lie in state in the Chapel of Lawrence E. Moon Funeral Home, 906 W. Flint Park Blvd., and may be viewed Saturday during family hour only. Mr. Cardozia "Doe" Hayman, Jr. was born to Cardozia and Rosie Lee (Kindley) Hayman on April 15, 1944, in Pine Bluff, Arkansas, there he attended Highland Baptist Church and was baptized, graduated from C.P. Coleman High School and met his future wife. Cardozia "Doe" Hayman, Jr. was one of 13 children, having 4 sisters and 8 brothers. Cardozia was a fun and outgoing individual, with a no nonsense attitude. He was brave and compassionate, always willing to help those in need, all with an ability to make those around him feel comfortable, while standing up for what he believed in. Cardozia was forever young at heart with a youthful attitude, being very athletic and having a love of playing and watching football and basketball. His love of Motown music kept him going out dancing and roller skating with many friends and some of his brothers. Later in life, Cardozia worked for GM in Flint, a member of Chevrolet UAW 659. Doe will

also be remembered for his love of Western movies.
