The Hollis Family moved to Memphis, TN where Catherine united with Salem-Gilfield Baptist Church under the leadership of Rev. A. L. McCargo. In 1950, she married Clarence Wilson and to this union two daughters, Sheila and Rhonda were born. Catherine moved to Flint, MI in 1958 and united with Canaan Missionary Baptist Church in 1959, under the leadership of Pastor Alfred L.C. Robbs and moved with him to Christ Fellowship Missionary Baptist Church.
