Family hour 10:30 a.m. Monday, May 3, 2010 at Macedonia Missionary Baptist Church, G-5443 N. Saginaw St., with funeral service commencing at 11 a.m., Pastor Alfred L. Harris, Sr., officiating. Mr. Evans will lie in state in the Chapel of Lawrence E. Moon Funeral Home, 906 W. Flint Park Blvd., and may be viewed from 10 a.m. - 8 p.m. Sunday. Charles was born August 5, 1925 in Nash County, North Carolina to the late Elijah "Son" and Ada (Wright) Evans. He accepted the Lord as his Savior as a young man and was baptized at the Pleasure Hill Baptist Church in Nash County. Charles married his beautiful wife, Ella Ree Richardson in 1948, and relocated to Flint, in 1954. He united with the Macedonia Missionary Baptist Church, and served as a member of the Progressive Laymen's until his health began to fail him. Charles worked at Fisher Body Division in Grand Blanc, Michigan, a division of General Motors Corporation and retired after thirty-seven years of dedicated service. Charles was a very devoted and loving husband and the most generous, giving person as a father. He would always want to give a person what they wanted and needed.
