CAMPBELL, Mr. Clarence Charles, Sr., "Poppa" - Age 87, of Flint, passed away Wednesday, April 16, 2008 at Brian's House in Davison. Family hour will be held at 10 a.m., April 21 (Monday) at the Metropolitan Baptist Tabernacle, 930 E. Myrtle St., with funeral services commencing at 11 a.m. Rev. Woody Etherly II officiating, Dr. A.J. Pointer, Pastor. Burial will be in Great Lakes National Cemetery, 4200 Belford Rd., in Holly. Friends and pallbearers will assemble at the church at 10 a.m. Mr. Campbell will lie in state in the Chapel of Lawrence E. Moon Funeral Home, 906 W. Flint Park Blvd., and may be viewed from 10a.m.-8p.m. Sunday (April 20) with family present from 3-6pm. Mr. Clarence Charles "Poppa" Campbell, Sr., was a man of incredible strength, gentle spirit, great wisdom and faith. He was known for his unwavering love and devotion to his family. Clarence was born April 2, 1921, in Montezuma, Ga., the son of the late Hardwick and Eula (Terrell) Campbell. He moved to Flint at an early age. He attended Flint Public Schools, graduating from Northern High School, class of 1939. He also attended Flint Junior College. On August 24, 1942, Clarence married Rose Holliday. Their union would last more than 65 years. In December 1942, Clarence answered our nation's call to service rising to the rank of Staff Sergeant in the U.S. Army and proudly served in the European Theatre in Italy during World War II. Clarence retired in 1977 from AC Spark Plug as a production supervisor with 36 years of service. Clarence enjoyed spending time with his family at his cottage at Shay Lake in Tuscola County, motor trips and watching sports on

television. Clarence and Rose were blessed with six children.
