Mrs. Cora Mae Williams was born on October 13, 1929 in Memphis, TN the daughter of William and Cora Emma McCoy (Fondly called "Little Sister") by her family. She was the 6th of seven children. She started her early education in Memphis, TN. Her family later moved to Chicago, IL where she furthered her education. It was there she met the love of her life Mr. Henry Williams; they were joined in Holy Matrimony on her birthday. Approximately one year later came their first-born son Wendell Simeon. The family later moved to Flint, MI, for her husband to obtain employment with General Motors. As the years passed they were blessed with six more children. God began to stir her heart after she saw the change in her husband, when he was filled with the Holy Ghost at Bethlehem Temple Church, 918 Spencer Street under the pastorate of the late District Elder Booker T.
