Cornelius was a graduate of Flint Northern High School. He later joined the United States Army, serving 3 years and was Honorably Discharged. Cornelius gained employment at a young age at St. John Meat Market. He later met and married Charatie Lee Marshall, from this marriage three daughters and two prior daughters was born. Cornelius later was employed with General Motors Power Train for 38 years. He joined Second Friendship Baptist Church under the leadership of the late great Rev. Anderson Fields. Cornelius, with the help of his mentored godfather, the late Deacon Landers Pruitt, he became a devoted Deacon. He later joined the Rising Star Missionary Baptist Church until his death.
