



Curtis Hayes,

September 16, 1944 - October 15, 2007

HAYES, Mr. Curtis Thomas, Jr. - Age 63, went home to be with the Lord on October 15, 2007 in Richmond (Houston), TX. Family hour 11:30AM Saturday, October 27, 2007 at New Jerusalem Full Gospel Baptist Church, 1035 E. Carpenter Rd., with the homegoing celebration commencing immediately at 12Noon. Bishop Odis A. Floyd officiating, Eld. Darryl E. Davis, presiding. Interment Lovedale Memorial Cemetery, G-5175 E. Bristol Rd. Friends and pallbearers will assemble at the church 11:30AM Saturday. Mr. Hayes will lie in state in the Chapel of Lawrence E. Moon Funeral Home, 906 W. Flint Park Blvd., and may be viewed from 6PM-8PM Thursday, October 25, 2007 and 10AM-8PM Friday, October 26, 2007. The sixth child of eight children, Mr. Curtis Thomas Hayes, Jr. was born in Swift, Missouri on September 16, 1944, the son of Curtis Hayes, Sr. and Elsie Mae (Quinn) Hayes. He attended elementary and high school through the 11th grade in Hayti, Missouri. In 1960, the family relocated to Flint, Michigan, where he continued his education and graduated from Flint Central High School. Curtis served in the United States Army, completed his tour of duty in Vietnam, where he received several awards including: National Defense Service Medal, Vietnam Campaign Medal, Overseas Service Badge, Vietnam Service Medal, Combat Infantryman Badge, and Marksman (Rifle M-14, Pistol, 45), and was Honorably Discharged in Pleiku, South Vietnam July 19, 1969. He retired from Fisher Body, a Division of General Motors in 1997, as a Senior Industrial Engineer. Curtis was a charter member of the New Jerusalem Full Gospel Baptist

Church where he served as a member of the Trustee Board, choir director, business manager for Inspirational Voices, and office clerk. Curtis was also a faithful member of The King's Men Chorus, and Computer Science Instructor for the Odis A. Floyd Center. Curtis worked vigorously throughout the community: teaching music at churches and to independent groups such as: Mt. Carmel Church Choir, Progressive COGIC Choir and the Highlight Gospel Chorus. Curtis was also the business manager for DeLano Mills and "Spiritually Connected." Curtis relocated to Houston, Texas, in 2005, where he helped organize and directed the Male Chorus of WSS Tri-County CDC, INC., and was the Computer Science Instructor, for WSS Tri-County, Richmond, Texas. Curtis leaves in God's Care: wife, Joyce of Houston, TX; 3 brothers, Min. Rodney (Kelly) of Lansing, MI, Thamous H., and Elder J.W.
