WILLIAMS, Mr. David L. - Age 51, went home to be with the Lord on Tuesday, February 24, 2009 at McLaren Regional Medical Center. Family hour 10AM Tuesday, March 3, 2009 at Grace Emmanuel Baptist Church, 3502 Lapeer Rd., with funeral and full Honor Guard service commencing immediately at 11AM, Min. Jeffrey Wheeler officiating, Pastor Marvin A. Jennings, Sr., Host Pastor. Interment Flint Memorial Park Cemetery, G-9506 N. Dort Hwy. Friends and pallbearers will assemble at the church 10AM Tuesday. Mr. Williams will lie in state in the Chapel of Lawrence E. Moon Funeral Home, 906 W. Flint Park Blvd., and may be viewed from 12Noon-8PM Monday. Mr. David Lucious Williams was born November 18, 1957, to the union of David and Norris Williams. He was the eldest of six children, who affectionately referred to him as "Junior". Besides excelling in academics, David showed an early passion for law enforcement as a police cadet at age 12. He attended Flint Northwestern High School, where he participated in many activities and was a dedicated Northwestern Wildcats fan. David was a proud graduate of the class of 1976. Shortly after graduation, he was hired by General Motors (GM) V-8 Engine Plant. At the age of 25, he relocated to California, where he resided for 2 years until being recalled to GM. David remained at GM until he graduated from the Flint Police Academy with his brother Mark. In 1991, David married Dawn Austin and from this union was born David R. 'Pockets' Williams, II. His first love was his sons. David's dedication to them was evident in all he did. He had many hobbies including,

photography, chess and playing cards. He was a life-long loyal LA Lakers basketball fan. David was most known for his love and appreciation of beautiful cars and beautiful women. He was known to go beyond the call of duty as an officer, which was evident in his actions on February 22, 2008 while he stopped to investigate a traffic accident. David's exemplary service has been recounted in the many stories that have been shared by fellow officers and the Flint Community. With his passion for life and a soul from heaven David had a gift of finding the good in everyone. We may have lost an angel here on earth, but heaven has found a new one. Mr. David L.
