Hunt High School in Columbus, MS. Harvie was a proud veteran of the United States Army, serving in the Vietnam War and receiving a Medal of Honor. He united in holy matrimony with Connie Marie Taylor in Flint, MI on February 10, 1970 and to this union two children were born. Harvie retired from Buick Motor Division in December of 1999 with 33 years of service and was a member of UAW Local 599.
