PRINGLE, Mrs. Dorothy - Age 86, passed away Saturday, September 17, 2011 at McLaren Regional Medical Center. Mrs. Dorothy Beatrice "Doll" Pringle was born December 9, 1924 in Oneida, Arkansas, to the late Rollison and Mosella (Bell) Sims. Dorothy received her education in the Oneida Public School System. Believing that God was truly her Savior, she gave her life to Christ at an early age. Dorothy moved to Flint, Michigan in 1957 and joined Antioch Missionary Baptist Church. While at Antioch, Dorothy sang in Choir No. 2 and served as a Nurse. Dorothy was also blessed to play the piano. She played for Evergreen Church for over 15 years. Dorothy was employed with Flint Osteopathic Hospital for many years. For more than three decades she was a member of Hasselbring Senior Center, where she enjoyed playing cards with her sister, Rosemary Chaney and other members. Determined not to let grass grow under her feet, Dorothy was a woman on the go! She loved bowling, gardening, traveling, and activities with family and friends. Dorothy could fish with the best of them. Beyond her kind, warm and gentle spirit, Dorothy was famous for her cakes and sweet potato
