She graduated from Whisenton High School in 1964 as an honor student and delivered the Salutatorian Speech.

Elon attended Mary Holmes College in West Point, MS and was chosen "Miss Mary Holmes" from 1965-1966. She was employed by Sears in Flint for 30 years where she held several positions including 12 years as a Custom-In-Home-Designer and Consultant. She was certified through the Window Fashions School of Chicago in 1992. Elon earned a degree in Broadcast Journalism in 1982. She resided in Flint, Michigan for most of her adult life. Elon was joined in Holy Matrimony to Claude Anderson on September 19, 1969, born to this union is one daughter, Semoria B. Anderson, she is the

mother of a son, Bryan Ingram.

Elon was an avid reader, she loved sewing, crafts, and many forms of music especially Jazz and Classical.

She accepted Christ and was baptized at the age of 16. After uniting with Bell Mount Baptist Church in DeKalb, MS. Elon loved people and spent many hours sewing and making quilts and clothing for others as gifts. Quilting became a big part of her life and she believed a real quilt was one made by hand in the old-fashioned way. She loved and could never get rid of one and would re-read many of them sometime more than once. Elon also worked with "Church Women United" of Genesee County and served as Chairperson for the "New Dimension Workshop." She was part of the Democratic Party. Elon was very active in school activities, she was on the Debating Team, a Majorette, and delivered Senior Class Salutatorian Speech. As a mom, she worked a volunteer for and was Girl Scout Leader, Colorguard Instructor and Band Booster at Flint Southwestern Academy, a member of the committee that formed the Northern Vikings Walking Club in 1987 and participated in the Crim Race for several years. She walked the Mackinaw Bridge (5 Miles) for several years. Following retirement, after 31 years of service, she became active in the political process and worked with the UAW and Genesee County.

She was an avid history buff and spent most summer vacations visiting historical sites and museums. Elon lived life to the fullest and felt honored by those who touched her life if, even in some small way. She felt that her children were one of her greatest accomplishments she cherished the greatest. They were the loves of her life, her best friend, her traveling buddy, her soul mate, the man who made her laugh and brought happiness and sunshine into her life for 56 years. Her husband, Claude Anderson, her grandchildren, Tavonte', Ebony and Breeanna gave her the greatest joy a proud grandma could experience.
