Mr. Moore graduated from Beecher High School, attended the Military Job Core and graduated from Eastern Michigan University with a Bachelor of Arts Degree. He retired from the Flint Public Schools with 30 years of service. Mr. Moore was a member of Mt. Sinai Missionary Baptist Church and he also attended the House of Prayer Missionary Baptist Church. During the years working in the school system Mr. Moore loved coaching basketball, track and his first loved was girls softball at Flint Southwestern Academy. His favorite saying was "Girls you're burning daylight"! Mr. Moore was an inspiration to all young peoples lives he touched. Mr. Moore relocated to Lawrenceville, GA in October 2007, where he continued to work with young people. He coached middle school basketball at North Cobb Christian High School.
