Eugene was a resident of Flint, Michigan and a member of New Jerusalem Full Gospel Baptist Church. He graduated from Lorain High School in Ohio. Eugene served in the United States Air Force as a Mechanic in WWII. He later moved to Michigan and joined in Holy Matrimony with Leola Carlidge.
