Fannie grew up in Alabama until she met her husband Thomas L. White, Sr. The couple, along with their two son's, Thomas L. White, Jr. and Alton White moved to Flint, Michigan around 1948. Fannie worked and retired from A. C. Spark Plug, a division of General Motors Corporation. Fairhaven Seventh Day Adventist Church was Fannie's worship home and she has been an active member of the church for more than 20 years. She enjoyed the Southwest Michigan's Seventh Day Adventist annual camp revivals and attended them up until a year ago. Fannie loved spreading the Word of God and she expressed her deepest desires of all of her friends and family meeting her in heaven one day. She wanted everyone to be saved. Never being one who was short on stories, Fannie could talk for hours and school you on how things used to be. She had the memory of an elephant! Fannie could recall many memories from way back in her past and would talk for hours about

family, life and God.

Fannie was a generous person and was always sending you out of her home with something. Fannie was also a jokester and loved to give that hearty laugh when she found something funny....which, most of the time, was at your expense. So much love she had for her family and how she wished we were all closer and knew one another, Fannie did not allow distance or age to keep her from being available for family or friends. She truly loved and valued her family. Although she was in her 90's, Fannie was not one to behave as such. She remained active and full of life for as long as her body allowed her to. At age 91 Fannie made her first trip out of the country and visited Brazil. This is a testament to her zeal for life and adventure. At an age where most people sit back and give up, Fannie was yet finding other ways to live her best life.
