Mrs. Fannie Lee Walker was born April 17, 1916 in Macon, GA to Emmie (Goodwin) and Willie Lightfoot. Her family relocated to Michigan City, IN and later to Flint, MI where she and her siblings were raised by her mother and stepfather, Alex Turner. In 1938, she married William Walker and had two children. They lived in Detroit MI where they were active members of the Peoples Community Church led by Pastor Martin C. Bolton. While a member of PCC, she participated in the Floral Club, April Birthday Club and Sunday School Class #3. Mrs. Walker was also an active member in the Greater Rising Star Grand Chapter Order of the Eastern Star, which she joined in 1948. In 2001, Mrs. Walker returned to reside in Flint MI and attended church with her children and grandchildren until uniting with the Mt. Carmel Baptist Church in 2008. She was an avid traveler and one of her

goals was to visit all 50 of the United States. She enjoyed talking to her friends and family, reading the bible, and doing word search puzzles before she lost her sight.
