Her spiritual life began and was nourished under the leadership of the Mount Zion A.M.E Church in Battle Creek. She was united in marriage to Carl Brown and to this union three children were born. Ms. Sheppard was a retiree of the Michigan State House of Representatives, where she served in several capacities. She resided in Cincinnati, OH for several years, but gave up her position there to return to Battle Creek, Michigan to provide support and care for the her parents during their illness. She was currently a resident of Flint.
