Gladys attended and graduated from Lane College. While attending Lane she met her soul mate Leroy Dismuke. Gladys and Leroy were united in Holy Matrimony in 1961. This is the same year she relocated to Flint, Michigan and where she began her 48-year career as an elementary school teacher for the Flint Community Schools. She received her Master's Degree in Elementary Education from Eastern Michigan University. In 1964 God blessed Gladys and Leroy with a son, Alan Roy Dismuke. Gladys was a faithful member of St. James C.M.E. Church for the past 41 years. She was a regional, state and national delegate for the Michigan Educational Association.
