Moon Funeral Home, 906 W. Flint Park Blvd., and may be viewed from 10AM-6PM Sunday. Mrs. Gloria Marsh Grant was born November 9, 1934 in Logan, West Virginia. She was the daughter of Cooper T. and Ida Marsh. She received her early education in West Virginia, graduating from Aracoma High in 1952. Gloria received her secondary education at Wilberforce University where she sang and traveled with the University Choir and pledged Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc., Zeta Chapter. She graduated from Wilberforce University in 1956 with a Bachelors in Education. Gloria then moved to Flint, beginning a career with the Flint Board of Education, teaching at both Dort and Parkland Elementary Schools. She also then joined the Vernon Chapel AME Church and worked within the music ministry over 30 years. Gloria met and married Normal Leso Grant, December 5, 1958 to this union one child, Lyria Regina was born. She then became employed by Genesee County Model Cities where she worked as a Program Coordinator, later working with Greater Flint OIC as a Lead Case Manager, lastly working as the GCCAA SYETP Director for over 10 years. During her lifetime, she has worked with numerous churches throughout Flint

contributing to the ministry through music and song.
