Harold Everett McKenzie passed away on Friday, February 6, 2026, at his residence in Flint, Michigan.

Harold was born on March 27, 1958, to Hubert Green McKenzie II and Patsy Ruth McKenzie. He was a longtime resident of Flint and also lived in California for 12 years. He graduated from Beecher High School, where he played varsity basketball and participated in band.

Harold worked for National Lumber while living in California and later for Builder's Square, Lowe's, and Menards after returning to Michigan. He also coached girls' basketball and was active in the Big Brothers Big Sisters program.

He was an unyieldingly devoted Michigan State fan and never hesitated to

shout, "Go Green!" Playing basketball and working out were important aspects of his life. Harold was outspoken, quick-witted, and many would say he missed his calling as a comedian or sports commentator. Above all, he was a loving father, brother, uncle, grandfather, and friend.

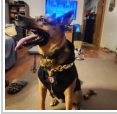
