August 9, 1943 - August 2, 2010

Burns, Mr. James Myron – Age 66, passed away Monday, August 2, 2010 at Hurley Medical Center. Family hour 1:30PM Tuesday, August 10, 2010 from the Chapel of Lawrence E. Moon Funeral Home. 906 W. Flint Park Blvd., Friends and pallbearers will assemble at the funeral home 1:30PM Tuesday. Mr. James Myron Burns was born August 9, 1943 in Flint, Michigan, the son of Marshall and Anne Williams. He graduated from Southwestern High School class of “1961”. In January of 1962, James joined the United States Airforce. His Airforce Duty Stations included, Texas Lackland AFB (January 1962-May 1962), Indiana University-Russian Language School (May 1962-February 1963), Texas Goodfellow AFB (February 1963-July 1963), Hof, Germany 6915th Security Squadron (July 1963-April 1965), Weathersfield, England 20th Tactical Fighter Wing RAFS (April 1965- January 1966) and Libya Wheelus AFB –TDY (November 1965). On January 18, 1968, James was honorably discharged. He graduated from University of Michigan with a B.A. in Physics on January 26, 1969. On March 26, 1969, he started his first job out of college as an engineer at Ford Motor Company. James began working for Automotive Group Rockwell International as an engineer on September 4, 1974. On March 21, 1977, he returned to Ford Motor Company. Mr. Burns left Ford Motor Company in 1983, to open Creole Kitchen at The Windmill Place in Flint, Michigan. In 1986 he began working for General Motors Saginaw Division. James received his teacher certification in 2005 from Eastern Michigan University. He taught at Flint Public Schools from

2005-2007. James volunteered as a judge for the Flint Science Fair annually. Mr. James Myron Burns leaves to cherish his memory: son, Gregory James Burns; 3 sisters, Meredith Barker, Dianne (Lawrence) Montgomery both of Flint, Carolyn (Gene) Smith of Bradenton, FL; brother, Ken (Tonya) Burns of Flushing, MI; a host of nieces, nephews, aunts, uncles and friends. Mr. Burns was preceded in death by his parents, Marshall, Sr. and Anne Burns and brothers, Marshall Burns, Jr. and Warren Burns.
