Deacon John Louis Hodgers was born on June 7, 1925 in Tishomingo, Mississippi to Robert and Modenia (Southward) Hodgers. John was a United States Honorably Discharged Veteran. He was reared in the Carter's Branch Baptist Church where he began his walk with God. At a Cherokee, Alabama baseball game John met Julia Mae Thomas and on July 10, 1948 she became his wife. After the birth of their four daughters, they relocated to Flint, Michigan seeking a better life for their young family. The family united with the Foss Avenue Baptist Church over 50 years ago, where he served in numerous capacities. John retired from General Motors Fisher Body Division No. 1 after 30 years of service, and was a faithful member of UAW Local 581.
