Mrs. Joyce Annetta Doggett Metcalf was born on February 13th, 1951 at Hurley Hospital in Flint, Michigan, she is the daughter of Joseph and Gwendolyn (Johnson) Doggett. Joyce attended Flint Public Schools and graduated from Flint Northern High school in 1969. She enlisted in the United States Air force, serving two years. Joyce also served in the Air force Reserves and retired after 20 years of service. She was a member of the Flint AMVETS Chapter 1001, where she was the first female member. Joyce served as secretary for her AMVETS chapter. She met Norman Metcalf in December of 1995 and they married on February 14, 2003. She retired from Hurley Hospital after 30 years of service. Joyce loved technology and considered herself to be very "tech savvy". She was proud that she was able to take apart a computer and put it back together on her own, just so she could say she did it. Joyce loved to possess the latest technological "gadgets" and was always looking forward to the next technological breakthrough so she
