



## Judith Busby

December 12, 1942 - December 26, 2005

BUSBY, Mrs. Judith - Age 63, passed away Monday, December 26, 2005 at her residence. Family hour 10:30AM Wednesday, January 4, 2005 at Quinn Chapel AME Church, 2101 Lippincott, with funeral service commencing at immediately 11AM. Pastor Stanley U. Sims, officiating. Friends and pallbearers will assemble at the church 10:30AM Wednesday. Mrs. Busby will lie in state in the Chapel of Lawrence E. Moon Funeral Home, 906 W. Flint Park Blvd., and may be viewed from 12Noon-8PM Tuesday. Mrs. Judith James Busby was born on December 12, 1942 in Flint, Michigan, the second child of Doris (Owens) & Virgil James and a descendant of two of Michigan's earliest African American settlers. Judith graduated from Southwestern High School "Class of 1960." In 1965, Judith was united in Holy Matrimony to Jerone Busby, together they had two children, Michelle and Jaison. They later relocated to Detroit, MI in 1967. Mrs. Busby graduated with honors from Wayne State University in Detroit with a Bachelors of Arts Degree. She retired from GMAC in 1993, shortly thereafter she opened her own interior decorating company, Designs by Judith. She became noted as a master quilter. Her quilts have been displayed at historical museums, major quilt shows, libraries, and churches and have adorned the front covers of several Michigan publications. Judith was an active and devoted member of the International Underground Railroad Monument Collaborative, the Charles H. Wright Museum of African American History and the Detroit Historical Museum.
