MITCHELL, Mr. Len - Age 60, passed away Friday, May 19, 2006 at his residence. Family hour 10:30AM Wednesday, May 24, 2006 from the Chapel of Lawrence E. Moon Funeral Home, 906 W. Mr. Len Mitchell was born July 14, 1945 in Butler, Alabama to Henry Peter and Georgia Mae Mitchell. He attended Choctaw County Schools and in 1965, he graduated as a Certified Electrician from Wenonah State Vocational Technical School in Birmingham, AL. Len served in the U.S. Army during the Vietnam War, and was stationed in Korea, where he attained the rank of Sergeant. On December 23, 1968, he was united in marriage to Rosa Marie Walker. In 1968, Len moved to Flint, Michigan. He secured employment at General Motors Buick Division and worked for 38 years, advancing to Skilled Trades Tool Repairman. Len accepted Christ at an early age and lived by the motto: "It is always better to give than to receive." He was a master craftsman and farmer, who freely gave of his time and talents to anyone in need, especially the elderly. He enjoyed working in his garden, and taking care of the family dog, "Boots."
