She united with Macedonia Missionary Baptist Church, where she served on numerous auxiliaries of the church including the Gospel Chorus and Mother's Board. Mother Thomas was a Teacher's Aide at Roosevelt Elementary School. She was also a Girl Scout leader and a Foster Grandparent at Hurley Medical Center for many years. Mother Thomas retired from the Flint Board of Education. Her hobbies included reading her Bible, listening to gospel music, playing dominoes, quilting, cooking and inspirational programs.
