Lucille graduated from Eastridge High, later finishing her education at Mott Community College in Flint, MI., where she received certification as a licensed CENA, along with certifications in Electrocardiography and Phlebotomy. Feeling a yearning in her heart, she knew the Lord had a purpose for her. In pursuit of a better life for herself and her children, she made the decision to relocate to Flint, MI. Being introduced to the Apostolic Doctrine, her faith began to grow.
