Frances attended Clark Elementary and Whittier Jr. High, graduating from Flint Central High School, "Class of 1953." She also graduated from Mott Community College with High Honors in 1990. Desiring to further her education, Frances enrolled at the University of Michigan-Flint where she majored in Spanish and obtained a Bachelor of Arts degree also with Honors. In an effort to master the language, Frances also studied in Spain and Mexico. She was a member of Phi Theta Kappa Honor Society. Frances retired from Consumers Energy after 21 years of service. She was member of Mt. Olive Missionary Baptist Church for over 60 years. She served on the Title I Citywide Advisory Council for many years holding the offices of Financial Secretary, Treasurer and Parliamentarian.
