Mother Weems confessed her love for Christ at the early age of 13 years old in Birmingham, Alabama where she was baptized by Rev. Henry Robinson. She graduated from Parker High School in Birmingham, Alabama. The family moved to Flint, MI in the early 1950's. Maudine married her high school sweetheart, the late Lawrence M. Weems and to this union brought five children, Thomas, Latrelle, Shelia, Latona and Many. Mother Weems was a faithful and active member of Morning Star Baptist Church under the leadership of the late Rev. H. Robinson. For 30 years she served as Church Secretary until her health prevented her regular attendance. She also served as Youth Director, Sunday School Teacher, Willing Workers Committee and a faithful Senior Choir member. She was a writer for the Flint Enquirer in the late 70's; she also was

the Public Relations Secretary to the late Moderator, Dr. A. J. Pointer for the Great Lake Baptist District Association. Mother Weems believed in excellence and in doing whatever task God called her to do. She had a stylish finesse with floral arrangements. Mother Weems also enjoyed singing, playing the piano and violin. She loved the finer things in life and had a great flair for fashion. Mother Weems unselfishly gave of herself to others.
