WATSON, Mr. Milton - Age 86, passed away Wednesday, December 29, 2010 at his residence. Family hour 11 a.m. Saturday January 8, 2011 at Mt. Flint Park Blvd., and may be viewed from 10-8 p.m. Friday. Mr. Milton King Watson was born November 2, 1924 in Magnolia, Arkansas to Wade and Ora (Christopher) Watson. Milton joined the United States Navy at the age of 20 and served in World War II, where he was Honorably Discharged receiving the Victory Ribbon and the American Area Ribbon. He moved to Muskegon, Michigan, where he met the love of his life Madeline Norton. Milton married Madeline, who he affectionately called "Mad." After which he and his wife moved to Flint, Michigan and unto this union 4 children were born: Baron, Sharon, Valerie and Cynthia. Milton loved his family with every fiber of his being. It was always family first. He moved to Flint, Michigan, where he worked for AC Spark Plug as a Jobsetter until his retirement after 49 years of service and was a member of UAW Local 651.
