Family hour 10:30 a.m. Friday, September 2, 2011 at Word of Life Christian Church, 460 West Atherton Road, with funeral service commencing at 11 a.m. Pastor George D. Wilkinson officiating. Moon Funeral Home, and may be viewed from 12 Noon-8 p.m. Thursday. Miss Madeline Rose Campbell was born November 6, 1952 in Flint, Michigan; she was the second daughter of Clarence C. Campbell Sr. and Rose Louise (Holliday) Campbell. Madeline attended Flint Community Schools. She enjoyed writing, photography and traveling. Madeline had the opportunity to see much of United States by car on road trips with her parents. She often spoke playfully and lovingly about being a member of the "Original Three," which referred to the three oldest children of Clarence and Rose Campbell's six children.
