Mr. Norman Metcalf was born August 23, 1930 in Wheatley, Arkansas. He was employed by General Motors (Fischer Body's Motors, and Buick City) for 30 years as an assembly worker and later in management as a Foreman. In 1993, he retired from General Motors, and later worked for more than a decade in security for Securitas where he was recognized, appreciated, and valued for being a reliable employee. Mr. Metcalf was married to his first wife Erma Moss for forty years prior to her death in 1993, and to his second wife Joyce Doggett for seven years prior to her death in 2010. He is survived by his children: Sheila (Henry) Bareiss of Rochester Hills, MI, Steven (Patricia) Metcalf of Atlanta, GA, Amie (Courtney) Garner of Grand Blanc, MI; step son, Eric (Erika) Harding of Atlanta, GA.
