BRADY, Pastor Emeritus Lindell - Age 86, passed away Thursday, September 23, 2010 at McLaren Regional Medical Center. Family hour 10 a.m. Friday October 1, 2010 at Grace Emmanuel Baptist Church, 3502 Lapeer Rd., with funeral service commencing at 11 a.m. Interment River Rest Cemetery, G-4413 Flushing Rd. Friends and pallbearers will assemble at the church 10 a.m. Friday. Pastor Brady will lie in state in the Chapel of Lawrence E. Moon Funeral Home, 906 W. Flint Park Blvd., and may be viewed from 12 Noon-8p.m. Thursday. Pastor Emeritus Lindell Luck Brady was born on January 24, 1924 in Girard, Kansas to William Luck Brady and Jessie Lee Wilson; he was the oldest of five children. His father passed when he was 13, and instilled in him a great devotion to family and helped to develop his strong leadership skills. The Lord used Pastor Brady's strong leadership ability to organize the Grace Emmanuel Baptist Church on May 15th 1966. Pastor Brady leaves to cherish beautiful memories: his loving and devoted wife of 62 years, Peggy Regina Brady; two children, Linda Maureen Vaughn and Steven William Brady of Reston, VA; four grandchildren, Kathy (William) Battle of Indianapolis, IN, Pastor Rabon Lindell (Mia) Turner of Evansville, IN, Jevon (Alisha) Williams of Xenia, OH and Brittney Hurst of Benton Harbor, MI; he also leaves, seven great grandchildren; one brother, Judge Paul (Xernona) Brady of Atlanta, GA; 2 sisters, Mary Holland of W.
