LIMBRICK, Mrs. Patsy Ruth - Age 68, passed away Monday, February 5, 2007 at McLaren Regional Medical Center. Memorial Service 6PM-8PM Friday, February 9, 2007 at Mt. Olive Missionary Baptist Church, 424 Kennelworth St. Family hour 10AM Saturday, February 10, 2007 at Mt. Olive Missionary Baptist Church, with funeral service commencing at 11AM. Dr. Roy I. Greer officiating. Interment Sunset Hills Cemetery, G-4413 Flushing Rd. Friends and pallbearers will assemble at the church 10AM Saturday. Mrs. Lambrick will lie in state in the Chapel of Lawrence E. Moon Funeral Home, 906 W. Flint Park Blvd., and may be viewed from 9AM-3PM Friday. Mrs. Patsy Ruth Scott was born October 27, 1938 in Little Rock, Arkansas. She was the fifth daughter out of the union of the late Mildred and Alfred Scott. Patsy completed her formal education in Little Rock where she graduated from Horace Mann High School. Patsy moved to Flint, Michigan in 1957, where she attended Baker Junior College. She was introduced to her husband Henry Limbrick by her brother Henry. Patsy and Henry married on August 15, 1959. Out of this union, three daughters were born. Patsy was very active in her daughter's school lives, where she could often be found volunteering to help. Eventually, her volunteer work turned into her occupation. Patsy retired from the Flint Board of Education as a home school counselor on January 22, 1999. Patsy accepted Christ as her personal Savior. She truly loved the Lord and was ever faithful to serve him and would witness about him to anyone she could. Patsy has been and active member of Mt. Olive Missionary Baptist

Church for over 45 years. During her membership, she served as a Deaconess, on the Women's Day Committee, as part of the Kitchen Ministry, in the Missionary Ruth Circle, and Vacation Bible Study. She was also a member of the Bible Study Fellowship (BSF), the Red Hatters Club, the NAACP, and a former member of Victorious Christian Women. Patsy was loved by everyone she met, and she had a special place in her heart for children, most of all, her six grandchildren. She chose to be called "Mama Dear" by her grandchildren in memory of her own mother, but she was known by many other names, including "Miss Love", "Mama Moosa" and "Aunt Pat". She will be missed by all. Mrs. Patsy R. Limbrick leaves to cherish her memory: beloved husband of 47 years, Henry Lee Limbrick; 3 daughters, Cheryl Limbrick of Flint, S. Marnise (Byron) Roberts of Canton, MI, and Krystal (Quintin) Sweat of Southfield, MI; 6 grandchildren, Winston, Shelbey, and Greer Roberts, and Desmond, Cameron, and Lexie Sweat; siblings, George (Rose) Rodgers and Sadie Briggance of Flint and Ann Harris and Sylvia Scott of Little Rock, Arkansas; 3 sisters-in-law, Gladys Scott and Minnie (Charles) Woods of Flint and Mary Rhodes of Orange, TX; goddaughter, Dana (David) Bush; godson, Clayton Goza of Flint; 2 aunts, Barbara Williams of Chino Hills, CA and Gladys Peterson of Little Rock, AK; a host of nieces, nephews, other relatives and friends.
