BRIDGES, Rev. John H. – Age 80, passed away Monday, November 17, 2008 at McLaren Regional Medical Center. Family hour 11:30AM Monday, November 24, 2008 at Metropolitan Baptist Tabernacle, 930 E. Myrtle, with funeral service commencing immediately at 12Noon, Rev. Woody Etherly officiating. Interment Gracelawn Community Cemetery, G-5710 N. Saginaw St. Friends and pallbearers will assemble at the church 11:30AM Monday. Rev. Bridges will lie in state in the chapel of Lawrence E. Moon Funeral Home, 906 W. Flint Park Blvd., and may be viewed from 10AM-8PM Sunday. Rev. John H. Bridges was born March 29, 1928 in Toledo, Ohio, the son of Tom and Mary Bridges. He was an associate minister at Metropolitan Baptist Tabernacle and was a teacher for the Great Lakes Leadership and Educational Congress. He did Missionary work in Africa from 1985 to 1992. Rev. Bridges attended Mott Junior College, where he earned a degree in Tailoring after which he became the owner of the House of Alterations. He retired from Chevrolet West as a millwright. Rev. Bridges was also a chaplain at Hurley Medical Center for many years until his illness. He loved his family, friends, church and most of all he loved God. Rev. John H. Bridges leaves to cherish his memory: sister, Nellie Farrow of Atlanta, GA; niece, Shirlene (Eddie) Simmons and many others; sister-in-law, Ruby (Doll) Morse of Newport News, VA; a host of other relatives and friends including, Rev.
