He joined the United States Army in May 1954 and was Honorably Discharged in 1957. Richard retired from the City of Detroit in 1995 after 32 years of service. He accepted the Lord in 1987, where he attended Solomon Temple Church in Detroit. Since moving to Mt. Morris, he had not found a church home but did attend various churches. On June 19, 1999, Richard and MaryAnn Brookins, were joined in Holy Matrimony. They enjoyed traveling, bowling, playing scrabble, gin rummy and watching sports together; they were inseparable.
