Rondle served in the Army National Guard from 1984 to 1988. He worked at Johnson City Hospital in Johnson City, TN from 1988 to 1994. Rondle moved back to Flint in 1994. He began working for Atreum Brighton in 1999 as a Process Technician. Rondle enjoyed watching football, playing basketball and going fishing.
