CHAMBRY, Deacon Roy, Sr. - Age 79, passed away Sunday, January 25, 2009 at Maplewood Manor in Clio, MI. Family hour 10AM Friday, January 30, 2009 at St. Paul Missionary Baptist Church, 2115 W. Coldwater Rd., with funeral service commencing at 11AM. Interment Sunset Hills Cemetery, G-4413 Flushing Rd.. Friends and pallbearer will assemble at the church 10AM Friday. Deacon Chambry will lie in state in the Chapel of Lawrence E. Moon Funeral Home, 906 W. Flint Park Blvd., and may be viewed from 12Noon-8PM Thursday. Deacon Roy Lee Chambry was born January 29, 1929 in Stafford, Alabama, the son of Will and Elvira Chambry. He confessed Christ at an early age at Halbert Missionary Baptist Church in Stafford, AL. In 1948, he moved to Flint, where he was employed by General Motors and worked at Fisher Body for 30 years, retiring in 1979. He also was a Crossing Guard for the Flint Board of Education. Deacon Chambry was a member of St. Paul Missionary Baptist Church, where he worked in the kitchen, served as a Deacon and Usher until his health began to fail. He loved his family, cooking, gardening and checking upon family and friends.
