Mrs. Ruth "Ruthie" Carolynn (Foster) (Long) Wilson was born July 17, 1928 in Ozark, Alabama to the union of Ozie and Mary Eva Foster (Jones). "Ruthie" graduated May 26, 1946 from Smith Brown High School in Arcadia, Florida. Upon graduating from High School, she received an Oratorical Scholarship and attended Bethune-Cookman College in Daytona Beach, Florida for 4 years, where she majored in English and Home Economics. During her college years, she was initiated into Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority, Inc., Beta Eta Chapter. She also attended the Historical Black University during the time when Founder Mary McLeod Bethune was president. Ruth moved to Flint, Michigan in the early 60's and worked as a waitress at the "Red Dog" Restaurant until she embarked on an opportunity to work at AC Spark Plug a division of General Motors and was a member of UAW Local 651, retiring in 1999 after 36 years of faithful service. While employed at AC Spark Plug, she was a member of the AC Chorale Group and

was an active United Way participant. Ruth was affectionately named "Ruthie" by her beloved co-workers. She was a faithful member of Christ Fellowship Missionary Baptist Church, where she attended Sunday School Class #9 and was a member of the Missionary Department. Ruth loved flowers and gardening was her favorite pastime. She nurtured the sickest plants back to health with her "Green Thumb." Ruth loved to cook and was famous for her homemade coleslaw, which will be missed at family gatherings. She also enjoyed doing crossword puzzles. Ruth was a music connoisseur and loved all kinds of music. Besides her daughter Stacie her next love was her Grand Dog, "Misty Bleu." She loved people and was well loved.
