Flint Park Blvd. and may be viewed from 12Noon-8PM Thursday. Mrs. Sammie Earl (Silas) Hill was born on Sunday, September 22, 1940 in Jackson, Mississippi to the parents of Sam and Reba Silas. Sammie was one of five children born to this union. Mrs. Hill accepted the Lord Jesus Christ as her personal Savior at an early age. She was baptized and joined St. Matthew Baptist Church in Jackson, MS, where she remained a faithful member until she relocated to Flint, MI. Sammie graduated from Lanier High School in Jackson, MS in 1959. She married Willie J. Hill on July 9, 1959 and to this union five children were born. Sammie and Willie relocated to Flint, MI in 1959, where they united with the Antioch Missionary Baptist Church under the pastoral leadership of Dr. L.W. Pryor. Sammie remained a very faithful member until her health started to decline. She was a member of the Nurses Guild for many, many years. Mrs. Hill was employed with the Flint Board of Education at Northwestern High School, retiring in 2001. Her hobbies were cooking, reading the paper, listening to Motown music, traveling, and shopping. She loved spending time with her family and
