She was a product of the Flint Public School system, graduating from Flint Central High School, "Class of 1953". Sharon had a long and accomplished career, she started her nursing career at Hurley Hospital and worked there seven years. Sharon worked as a Nursing Supervisor at Buick, before retiring in 1993. A dedicated christian, Sharon was a former member of Mt. Olive and a longtime member of Grace Emmanuel Baptist Church. She served diligently and faithfully as past leader of the Nursing Ministry, and was a member of the Three Score & More Seniors Ministry.
