ROBINSON, Mrs. Sundra - Age 57, passed away Saturday, September 20, 2008 at Brian's House. Family hour 10AM Saturday, September 27, 2008 at Grace Emmanuel Baptist Church, 3502 Lapeer Rd., with funeral service commencing at 11AM, Pastor Marvin A. Jennings, Sr., officiating. Interment Crestwood Memorial Cemetery, G-2020 E. Hill Rd. Friends and pallbearers will assemble at the church 10AM Saturday. Mrs. Robinson will lie in state in the Chapel of Lawrence E. Moon Funeral Home, 906 W. Flint Park Blvd., and may be viewed from 3PM-8PM Friday. Mrs. Sundra Lois Robinson was born January 20, 1951, in Tyler, Texas to Harold and Mary Arterberrie. She was the second of five children born to the Arterberrie Family. Sundra accepted Christ at an early age. She was a dedicated member of Grace Emmanuel Baptist Church, where she served on several committees and boards. Sundra enjoyed traveling, evangelizing, socializing, and especially being a mother and a granny. Sundra graduated from Southwestern High School in Flint, Michigan and obtained her technical degree from Mott Community College. She began her career at General Motors where she was one of the first black female electricians at Fisher Body. In 2000, Sundra retired from Delphi. She was formerly married to Joseph Robinson and from their union two children were born, Syreeta Moeisa and Vanessa Renee.
