Flint Park Blvd., and may be viewed from 1-8 p.m. Thursday. Ms. Tamara Lynn Green was born September 14, 1963 to the union of Charles and Gwendolyn Green. She graduated from Flint Northwestern High School in 1981 and attended Wilberforce University in Wilberforce, Ohio. Tamara was employed with the Flint Board of Education and Mass Transportation Authority prior to becoming disabled. Tammy was baptized at an early age by Reverend R.R. Gordon of the St. Paul Missionary Baptist Church. Her love of music began when she became one of the original members of the Angel Choir of St. Paul Missionary Baptist Church. She grew to be a pianist and organist under the tutelage of Cinda Anderson and this passion evolved when she became co-founder and organizer in part, of the St. Paul Baptist Church Male Choir. A psalmist with the Great Lakes District Choir, she was asked often to lend her melodious soprano voice to different venues throughout the city.
