BAKER, Mr. Thomas W. "Tommy" - Age 58 of Flint, passed away Monday, March 12, 2007 at his residence. A celebration of life service will be held 10:30AM Monday, March 19, 2007 at Mt. Flint Park Blvd., and may be viewed from 10AM-8PM Sunday. "Tommy" was born on December 26, 1948 to Leona Grier and Robert Baker. He married Mary Baker (Ware) on October 3, 1970. He loved spending time with his family and grandchildren. He was a man that always smiled at life and lived it to the fullest. He enjoyed playing cards with friends while watching sports events. Hosting the world's largest Superbowl parties to bring everyone close together. He was a great cook and expert barbeque chef. He also enjoyed gardening, playing basketball, and jogging to keep in shape. His jogging inspired many without words to challenge themselves to reach for more. Also known as "Touchdown Tommy" he was a star high school football player and graduate of Southwestern High School. He also played Semi-Pro football for the Pontiac Arrows. He then attended Ferris State University until he enlisted in the U.S. Army. He was a Veteran serving during the Vietnam Conflict. He proudly served his country from 1968-1970 as a Military Policeman. He began his employment as a committeeman for UAW Local 651

before being promoted to a Supervisor for A.C. Spark Plug now Delphi Electronics where he retired after over 35 years. "Tommy" was the supervisor that everyone loved to work for.
