WILBERT, Mr. Vernon W. - Age 61, passed away Saturday, August 8, 2009 at McLaren Regional Medical Center. Family hour 10AM Tuesday, August 18, 2009 at First Trinity Missionary Baptist Church, 1226 Beach St., with funeral service commencing at 11AM, Rev. Eddie Chaney officiating. Pastor F.O. Mr. Wilbert will lie in state in the Chapel of Lawrence E. Moon Funeral Home, 906 W. Flint Park Blvd., and may be viewed from 12Noon-8PM Monday. Mr. Vernon Wayne "V.W." Wilbert, Sr. was born May 16, 1948 in El Dorado, Arkansas to the parents of Albert W. and Verna M. Wilbert. Vernon had accepted Christ and was a faithful member of Community Fellowship Baptist Church, under the leadership of Pastor E. Chaney. His parents instilled in him Christian values and a desire for learning. Vernon attended Flint Public Schools, graduating from Flint Central High School. Upon graduating, he enlisted in the United States Army. He attained the ranking of Sergeant while stationed in Germany and in 1968 was then stationed in Vietnam. Vernon returned to Flint in 1969 with an Honorable Discharge and Bronze Medal. He attended 1½ years of community college and then became employed with General Motors. Vernon then took a job with the Railroad Company and was employed for 3 years. On November 4, 1974, he became a Flint Firefighter, retiring as the First Driver with 24 years of service. He enjoyed his profession and was a dedicated Fireman. Vernon later

attained his Realtor License and dabbled in Real Estate. He had many interest, one was learning the Bible, cooking and an avid reader of many topics. His passion was for raising unusual dogs like the Boerboel, from West Africa, where he had them shipped to America, barbequing and bragging about how good it was, but always willing to share. Vernon was a gracious, caring, blunt, outspoken and very opinionated man, who had no problem expressing himself to others. He always believed in helping others, especially children. Vernon had a love for music of all kind and loved to fish when he had time. He was also a life-long fan of the New York Yankees and Oakland Raiders.
