During the warm months, she could sit on her porch and enjoy the services being broadcast outside by the Austin Avenue Baptist Church across the street. “Jenny” was a strong, independent woman that had no problem speaking her mind. She was fiercely loyal to her family and friends. “Jenny” enjoyed music, shopping, playing the lottery, phone chatting with her friends and looking for the best eats in town. She loved the Lord, and she gave thanks and honor to him every day of her life. “Jenny” knew reaching the age of 96 was a blessing and a gift from God. 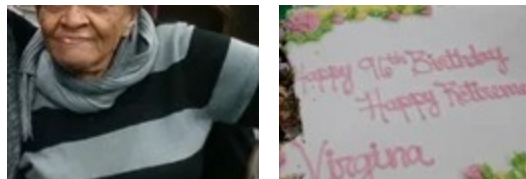

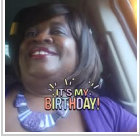
